It's a chance to learn what CPA funds can be used for like open space, historic preservation, affordable housing, and recreation, and how to apply. CPC members will walk through the application process and answer questions. Each year, voters at Town Meeting decide how to spend money collected through the Community Preservation Act (CPA) surcharge from recommendations made by the Commission. ARPA Project List

As the Town of Southborough completes some big projects thanks to ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funding, we are highlighting the opportunities we took to make enhancements an upgrades to the Town. Below find some highlights of how we took advantage of this economic stimulus package:



- Approximately \$150K was spent on WiFi and website upgrades to make town services and remote meetings more seamless.
- Police body cameras were purchased for all officers to enhance safety of staff and the public.
- The Woodward School A/C system, Trottier HVAC system and the Finn A/C and mold mitigation were all funded fully or partially by ARPA monies.
- Transfer Station defibrillators were added for employee and the public's safety.
